



How often have you used the library during COVID-19 restrictions?






USE DURING COVID

Kids area. But needs more fun hands-on things there too.




FREQUENCY OF REMOTE USE




10→ How easy is the library to use & get around?

- I wish there was a spring floor for dancing
- I wish there were more books
- I'm completely spoiled by libraries (thanks Telluride (20), so it's a little smaller than I'm used to. But it's a beautiful building!

- It is a beautiful building however, I think it is bigger than needed and wish my tax dollars would be used for something more rounded including a rec center that my kids and I would be more interested in using. We can access books online and have our own books at home.
- I think the visitor's center could use improvement. I would like to see a local directory of artisans, crafts persons, independent contractors. handy persons, mechanics, etc - I have absolutely no way to seek out services in Norwood because I don't personally know the people who do independent work. Compared to other visitor centers in the region, this hole in the wall "room," where locals pile their junk that has nothing to do with travel and tourism, and sit at the table and do homework at, is a complete joke. If I were visiting Norwood and discovered this, I'd shake my head, leave and find another place with more info.
- Have you sat and tried to work in the computer area? It's just plain awkward and uncomfortable. especially when other people staring at you through all the I windows. This space not not at all conducive to focus and productivity. Tried working there once, never again. I'd rather borrow a computer and sit outside in my car for the peace and quiet. P.S. Referring to guestion #2 on this survey, I am offended. Where is the "Other" or "I'd rather not say" category? This library clearly doesn't show support for minorities including gender neutrality and the Igbtq+ community not only within its space, but it's staff, it's programming, and it's book and movie offerings as well.

- Waste of space in high ceilings. Design is stark and should look more like a barn but it looks like a metro building
- Why was the big conference room built to be so loud and echoey? Even with the divider in, you can hear everything loud and clear in room on the other side of the divider. It's impossible to conduct a meeting or event without noise from the other room. This is not a warm or welcoming space, but a cold and overly loud space. It was very poorly designed. And the adjacent "kitchen," what a waste of space. It's massive and vet, there is now way to use it commercially. Too bad, that had serious potential. Speaking of noise, why isn't the library section completely closed off from the main entrance area? Placing a few hanging pieces of fabric doesn't stop all of the noise made in the lobby from coming into what should be a quiet library. I would like to know who picked the furniture. It's the unglued, most uncomfortable furniture I've ever had the pleasure of sitting in. You can't go more than 30 minutes without your bum going numb. And it looks like IKEA barfed up the 60s. Lastly, all the exposed beams and hvac everywhere, is just plain ugly.




